The membership dues are \$20. Dues may either be paid in exact cash or in a check made out to LaSalle H.S. Only new members need to order a Key Club t-shirt.****d. To be an active member, the student must attend a minimum of five (5) meetings and serve
a minimum of 15 hours. Otherwise, the student will be declared inactive and will not be
allowed to take membership the following year without a review and possible reinstatement by the officers.****e. A member who signs up for an activity but does not attend that activity will be noted in the
membership files. After three such occurrences, the member will be declared inactive and will not be allowed to be reinstated
during the current year nor take membership
